AFFIDAVIT OF ROBERT J. URAM

I, Robert J. Uram, hereby declare and state as follows:

1. I am a partner with the law firm of Sheppard, Mullin, Richter & Hampton LLP, attorneys for The California Valley Miwok Tribe ("Tribe"), The Tribal Council, Yakima Dixie, Velma WhiteBear, Antonia Lopez, Michael Mendibles, Evelyn Wilson and Antone Azevedo.


2. On December 14, 2011, I spoke by telephone with Kenneth Rooney, counsel for the Defendants in the above-named action. I asked Mr. Rooney to include in the administrative record the 503 genealogies and related information that the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") received from individuals claiming membership in the Tribe, in response to a public notice that the BIA published in April 2007 [*see* AR 002105]. Mr. Rooney informed me that the Assistant Secretary – Indian Affairs had not considered the genealogies in arriving at his August 31, 2011 decision regarding Tribal membership, which Plaintiffs challenge in this action,

and that Defendants therefore did not consider the genealogies to be a part of the administrative record.

3. On December 28, 2011, my partner M. Roy Goldberg again asked Mr. Rooney, via email, to include, among other documents, the 503 genealogies in the administrative record, along with the letters that the BIA had drafted to each of the 503 individuals who submitted genealogies ("Jointly referred to as the "Genealogies") While Defendants added other documents to the record, consistent with Mr. Rooney's representation that the Assistant Secretary did not consider the Genealogies, the Defendants did not add them to the administrative record in this case.

I declare under penalty of perjury pursuant to the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing is true and correct.
