Notice of Motion and Motion for Summary Judgment (37-2008-00075326-CU-CO-CTL)

Broadway, San Diego, California 92101, Defendant California Gambling Control Commission (Commission) will move the Court for Summary Judgment.

Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 437c, subdivision (f)(1), the Commission moves for summary judgment on the following grounds:

- 1) The First Amended Complaint fails to state facts sufficient to state a cause of action for injunctive relief, declaratory relief, or a writ of mandate because the plaintiff has not established an entitlement to disbursement of the quarterly Revenue Sharing Trust (RSTF) payments that have been withheld and accrued for the benefit of the California Valley Miwok Tribe during the pendency of an intra-tribal leadership dispute.
- 2) The first amended complaint fails to state facts sufficient to state a cause of action for injunctive relief, declaratory relief, or a writ of mandate because the Commission has not wrongfully withheld quarterly RSTF payments from the plaintiff.

This motion will be based on this notice, the attached memorandum of points and authorities, the Commission's Statement of Undisputed Material Facts, the attached declarations of Neil D. Houston, Tina Littleton, and Sylvia Cates, the Commission's request for judicial Notice, the complete files and records of this action, and such other oral and documentary evidence as may be presented at the time of hearing.

WHEREFORE, the Commission prays that the instant motion be granted and that judgment in favor of the Commission be entered accordingly.
